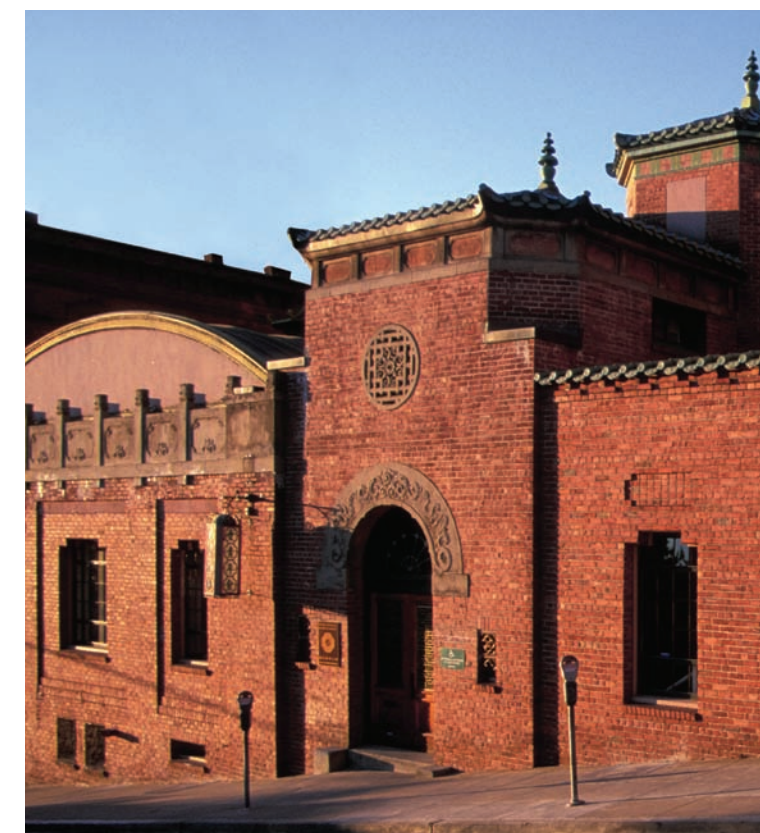

## WELCOME TO THE CHINESE HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF AMERICA (CHSA) MUSEUM & LEARNING CENTER!

Founded in 1963, CHSA is dedicated to the documentation, preservation, and education of Chinese American history. Through historic objects, interactive exhibits, and public programs, CHSA tells the story of the Chinese in America.

CHSA's current location on 965 Clay Street was designed by renowned architect, Julia Morgan. Completed in 1932, the building first opened its doors as the Chinese Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA). Since 2001, the building, with its unique and well-preserved features, has been home to the CHSA Museum.

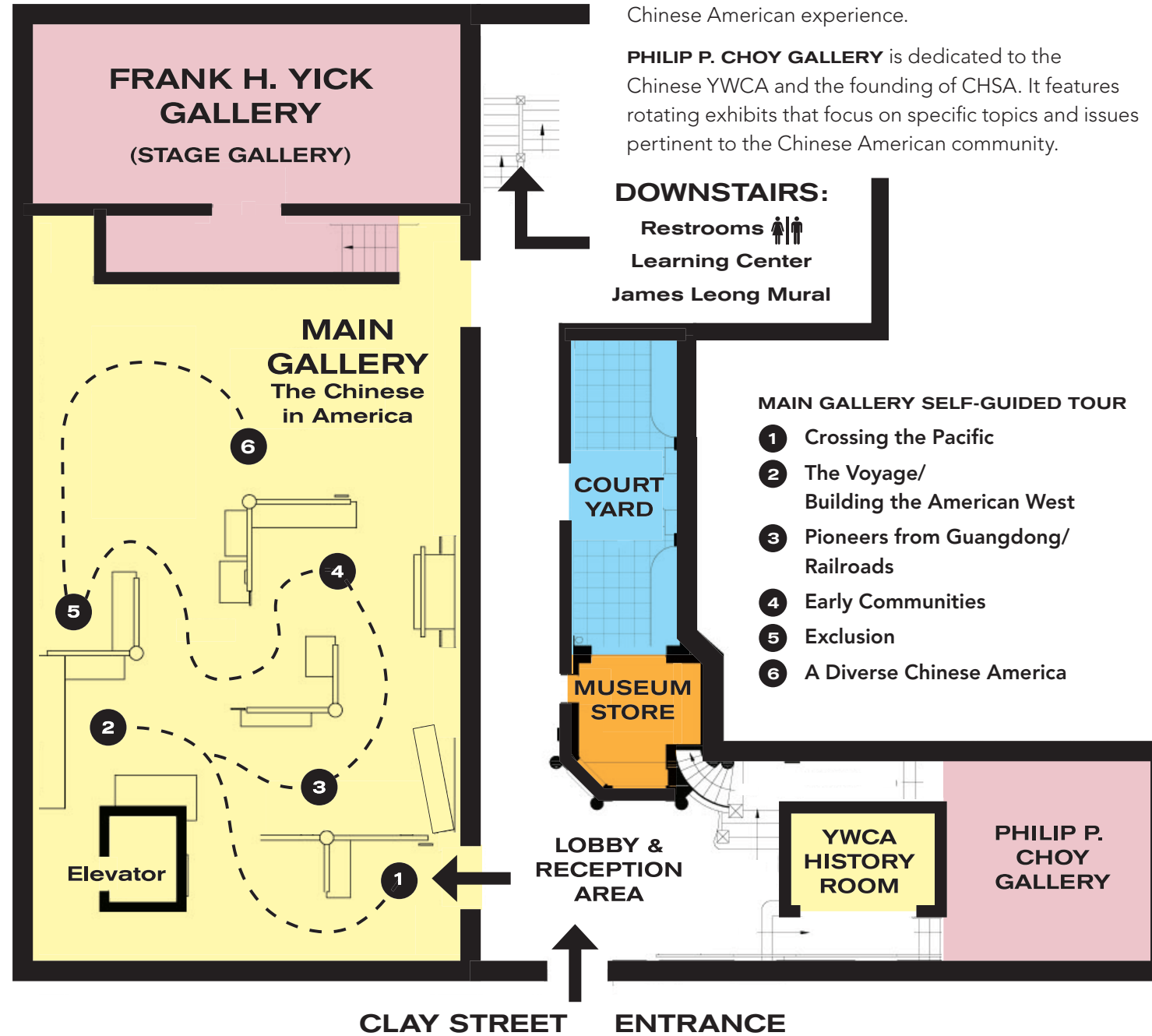
Cover: James Leong, *One Hundred Years' History of the Chinese in America* (detail), 1952.

# EXHIBITION HIGHLIGHTS
